

Exploring the Impact of Virtual Exchange on Teacher Education

8 - 9 February 2023
University of León, Spain

BACKGROUND TO THE CONFERENCE

This conference brings together teachers, researchers and policy makers who are interested in how Virtual Exchange can be used in professional development programmes as well as Initial Teacher Education. Virtual Exchange refers to the different educational approaches to connecting people from different cultural backgrounds in online collaborative learning.

The conference is organised by the Erasmus+ project consortium VALIANT in collaboration with the academic organisation UNICollaboration. VALIANT was an Erasmus+ KA3 European Policy Experiment project (2021-2024) which developed Virtual Innovation and Support Networks. These are defined as Virtual Exchange programmes which bring together teachers, student teachers and experts in facilitated online collaboration around real-world educational issues. UNICollaboration is an organisation that supports telecollaboration and virtual exchange in Higher Education. It promotes practice, research and further policy development in this area.

This conference will provide a venue to explore what research-based studies and practical reports can tell us about how different approaches to Virtual Exchange can contribute to the professional development of teachers and student teachers. It will also provide insights on the perspectives and experiences of teachers using Virtual Exchange in higher education or non-formal educational contexts. We will have the opportunity to listen to the voices of teachers and student teachers who have organised and who have participated in these innovative learning initiatives, and we will also hear from researchers who are carrying out academic studies in this area. Furthermore, we will reflect on the role of policy making and how public authorities can contribute to promoting Virtual Exchange as well as helping to overcome the barriers to the integration of these activities in Initial Teacher Education and Continuous Professional Development.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- The programme included in this document is provisional and may change due to cancellations. An updated version will be made available closer to the time of the conference on the [conference website](#). This will include abstracts of all presentations.
- All presentations (except for the keynotes) are **20 minutes long with 5 minutes for questions** and 5 minutes for switching rooms.
- All parallel sessions will take place in the **Faculty of Education** at the University of León. Plenary sessions, coffee breaks and poster presentations will take place in the faculty of Economics. Both buildings are next to each other and are on the main campus which is approximately 20-25 minutes walk from the city centre.
- **Coffee will be available for free** in the mornings and afternoons. The receptions on Wednesday and Thursday night are also free to attend and will have tapas and drinks. However, participants are expected to pay for their own lunches in the campus cafeterias.
- It is **NOT possible to have co-presenters participate online** during the conference.
- We are exploring having a special issue of the [Journal of Virtual Exchange](#) including a small number of articles coming from the conference. This will be confirmed and more details offered at a later date.
